District Councillor: I, along with two Parish Councillors, had a meeting with the highways officer in early February, where I wanted to remind him of two outstanding issues that several residents have raised with me. I have asked again if the kerbs down Kiddington Road can be cleared of compacted debris, as it is difficult to step aside for oncoming vehicles, especially with children or a pushchair. I also reiterated the problem of residential streets where the surface tarmac has eroded, but not deep enough for pothole filling. I have sent a list of seven such streets, and the highways officer is going to see if the appropriate team could do them all, with

what is termed "minor patching". I have also sent reminders about the blocked drain in Westcot Barton (opposite The Chase), and the lack of white lines on the bend before you reach Holt. Possible grants for youth activities WODC have a small pot (£30k) of money available for the promoting of activities for young people.
